Data Breach Alert - Russian Hackers Steal 1.2 Billion Passwords

Have you heard of the CyberVor hackers in Russia? Hold Security, the Milwaukee firm that discovered the hack this summer, gave them the name CyberVor since "vor" means "thief" in Russian. These thieves stole 1.2 billion usernames and passwords, along with 540 million email addresses across 420,000 sites.

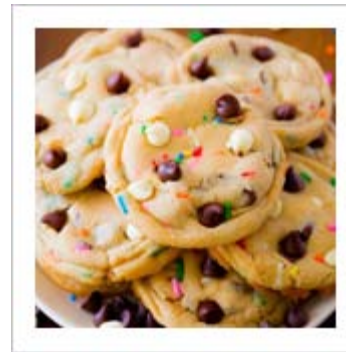

This Month's FAQ - How Can I Turn Off Facebook's Notification Sounds?

On Facebook	All notifications, sounds on	View
Email	Only important notifications	Edit
Push notifications	Some notifications	View
Text message	Text notifications are turned off	Edit

Question: I'm getting tired of hearing notification sounds every time I have Facebook activity. How do I turn off the sounds?

Answer: There's a quick-and-easy fix for this problem that will reduce the noise in your life! To turn off Facebook's notification sounds:

1. Go to your Facebook page.
2. Click the upside-down triangle in the upper-right corner of the blue bar, then click the "Settings" link.

3. In the left column, select "Notifications."
4. Where it says "On Facebook," click the "View" link and uncheck "Play a sound."
5. Click the "Save Changes" button.

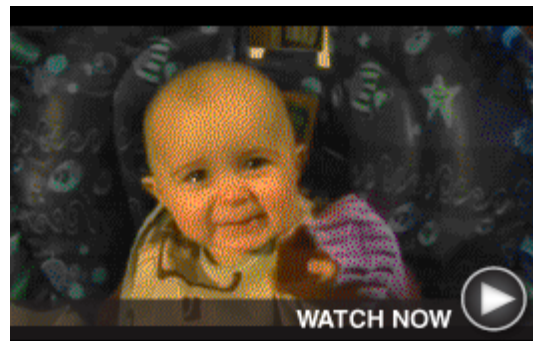

Baby Tears Up When Mother Sings

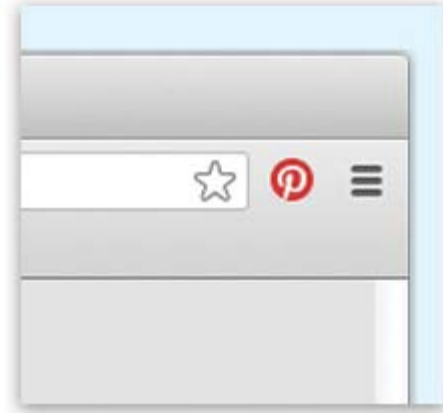
When this mother sings a beautiful, yet sad, song to her 10-month-old baby, the baby reacts by crying sweet tears sure to melt your heart.

Short Tutorial - How To Add The Pin It Button To Your Browser

The Pin It button makes it easy to Pin things to Pinterest that you find on the web — like a recipe from your favorite food blog or a photo from a travel site. You can get this button from the Pinterest Goodies page at <http://about.pinterest.com/en/goodies#browser>.

Here are the steps to adding the Pin It button to Chrome, Firefox, Internet Explorer, or Safari:



Chrome

1. Go to <http://about.pinterest.com/en/goodies#browser> from Chrome (or get the Pin It button at the Chrome web store at <https://chrome.google.com/webstore/category/apps>).
2. Click "Install Now."
3. After installing, you'll see a Pin It button any time you mouse over an image. Or, click the red P at the top of your browser whenever you find something on the web you want to Pin.

Firefox

1. Go to <https://about.pinterest.com/assets/ext/Pinterest-Firefox.xpi>.
2. Click "Install Now."
3. After installing, click the red P at the top of your browser whenever you find something on the web you want to Pin.

Internet Explorer

1. Go to <http://about.pinterest.com/en/goodies#browser>.
2. Drag the button to Internet Explorer's bookmark bar.
3. After installing, just click Pin It from your bookmarks whenever you find something on the web you want to Pin.

Safari

1. Go to <http://about.pinterest.com/en/goodies#browser> from Safari.
2. Click "Install Now."
3. After installing, you'll see a Pin It button any time you mouse over an image. Or, click the P at the top of your browser whenever you find something on the web you want to Pin.
